Personal Protective Equipment and General Lab Attire

Personal protective equipment (PPE) helps minimize exposure to hazards

Basic protection for most laboratories include:

Lab coats, gloves, safety glasses or goggles, closed-toe shoes, and long pants.

- Gloves should be selected based on the chemical or physical hazard present. Gloves should be worn within the laboratory only and not in common areas.
- Chemical splash goggles or goggles and face shields should be worn when there is a risk of splashing hazardous materials or flying particles.
- Respirators may be required for protection against airborne contaminants. Medical clearance and fit testing are required prior to use:
   EHS Respiratory Protection Program
- Any laboratory operation that exposes laboratory personnel to a significant noise source may require hearing protection. Noise assessment and recommendations: <u>EHS Hearing Conservation</u> <u>Program</u>
